4. Resident Trash & Recycling Survey Update and Discussion

Discussion about results of the survey thus far begin. Discussion includes the rollout of the survey through social media, the Town's website and the school's newsletters. As of today, Lee dropped some off at the Council on Aging and they were going to help with getting the word out to the seniors in town. Christina also brought some to the ambassadors at the Town Hall.

There are currently about 635 responses to the survey and about roughly 88.6% are satisfied or very satisfied with the Town's trash and recycling program. Steve goes through various questions and shows how the results can be broken down in multiple ways to get an overall picture of the current situation.

Figures show about roughly 46% of those that took the survey put out a full trash barrel and about 68% a full recycle barrel; discussion continues about further ways to breakdown the numbers.

Roughly 20% of the current survey takers were unaware of the pink bag curbside program that the Town currently uses. Kevin recommends that a campaign be done so that more people become aware of the pink bags. In addition to the pink bags, the Town does have two active bins at the Recycle Park for textiles. Since the Simply Recycling program began in June of 2019, there have been approximately 10,000 pounds per month collected in textiles.

Of the current people surveyed about 22% or ¼ do not use the recycle park.

Also, about 83% of people surveyed feel they have good knowledge and understanding of how to recycle. Better education is needed for recycle and Steve did state that a sticker for the recycle cart was one comment he saw with regard to many other comments.

Another quick figure was that about 80% of the people surveyed would like to see the trash and recycling stay included in the taxes as it is now.

Overall the survey is going well and will stay open for the next few weeks. Ways to get it out to more people are discussed including Instagram and Twitter. Steve is also going to forward to the Committee the comments that were included with the survey that people filled out for the Committee to review.

Discussion about what the surrounding towns (Hockomock area towns) are doing with regard to trash and recycling. Christina and Lee will talk with Kathi to get the information on how these towns are handling trash and recycling and how their situation came to be. They gather some information before the next.
