- **Revised Gathering Order in effect**

As of Tuesday, August 11, there is a [revised order](#) in effect on gathering sizes. Under the updated gatherings order:

- Indoor gatherings are limited to eight people per 1,000 square feet, but should not exceed 25 people in a single enclosed, indoor space.
- Outdoor gatherings in enclosed spaces are limited to 25 percent of the facility's maximum permitted occupancy, with a maximum of 50 people in a single enclosed outdoor space.
- Face coverings are required where more than 10 people from different households will be mixing.

Violations of this order may result in a civil fine of up to \$500 per violation.

- **Enhanced Community Data**

The Baker-Polito Administration released additional data on community level spread of COVID-19 in order to target additional resources and implement community specific strategies to stop the spread of the virus. This data reports on the average daily cases per 100,000 residents, average percent positivity, and total case counts, for all 351 Massachusetts cities and towns over the last two weeks.

Based on the average daily cases per 100,000 residents, each city or town has been designated as a higher risk, moderate risk, or lower risk community. Going forward, this information will be updated and included in the Department of Public Health's weekly [public health dashboard](#), which is published each Wednesday.
