- **Traveling outside of Massachusetts**

All visitors and returning residents entering Massachusetts must follow the current travel orders. The Commonwealth has made great progress to slow the spread of COVID-19 and gradually re-open the economy, and all visitors have a responsibility to help us keep transmission levels as low as possible.

Anyone entering Massachusetts, including returning residents who do not meet an exemption*, are required to:

- Complete the [Massachusetts Travel Form](#) prior to arrival, unless you are visiting from a lower-risk state designated by the Massachusetts Department of Public Health; and
- Quarantine for 14 days or produce a negative COVID-19 test result that has been administered no more than 72 hours prior to your arrival in Massachusetts.

If your COVID-19 test result has not been received prior to arrival, visitors, and residents must quarantine until they receive a negative test result.

*Exemptions include: returning from a lower risk state; transitory travel; persons commuting for work or school; patients seeking or receiving medical treatment; military personnel; or workers providing critical infrastructure services.

While traveling, please remember we are all responsible for stopping the spread of the virus and protecting ourselves and others.

- Avoid public places if possible;
- Wear a mask if you are within six feet of other individuals, in a situation or setting where you are unable to maintain six feet from others, or in a public business or public or private transportation carrier or for-hire vehicle;
- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially before you eat;
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth, with unwashed hands;
- Cover your cough and sneezes with a tissue and discard it in a closed container; and
- Clean frequently touched surfaces and objects.

Massachusetts Travel Order

Effective August 1st all travelers entering the Commonwealth must comply

What are the rules?



- Visitors and returning residents are required to fill out the “**Massachusetts Travel Form**” (unless you are traveling from a lower risk COVID-19 state or exempt)
- Visitors and Massachusetts residents coming from any other state or jurisdiction are required to **fill out the form, and to quarantine for 14 days or produce a negative COVID-19 test result** administered not more than 72 hours prior to arriving in Massachusetts
- Visitors and returning residents that took a COVID-19 test prior to arrival but have not yet received results **must quarantine until they receive a negative test result**
- **Failure to comply could result in a \$500 fine per day**

What should I do before I travel?



- Prior to your arrival in Massachusetts, visit [Mass.gov/MAt traveler](https://www.mass.gov/MAt traveler) to fill out the form
- If you take a COVID-19 test, have your negative test results available
