


COMMUNITY UPDATE COVID-19



■ Population ■ Fully vaccinated individuals ■ Partially vaccinated individuals



- COVID-19 Reminders

Testing/symptoms

Testing is our best tool to identify those who have been exposed and slow the uptick in cases. Anyone experiencing even mild symptoms should get tested, as well as anyone who has had a close contact with an individual who has tested positive for COVID-19. Testing is encouraged regardless of vaccination status. <https://www.mass.gov/covid-19-testing>

Masks

If a person is unvaccinated, it is strongly recommended that he/she still wear a mask indoors in public spaces. Those who are vaccinated may also choose to continue wearing masks indoors. Note that masks are required in certain settings (rideshares, livery, taxi, ferries, MBTA, Commuter Rail and transportation stations), in healthcare facilities and in other settings serving vulnerable populations, such as congregate care settings). Masks are also recommended for unvaccinated individuals when they are indoors and unable to socially distance.

- Spread COVID-19 to others



Get A COVID-19 Vaccine For Your Child As Soon As You Can



- COVID-19 vaccines are safe and effective
- Your child will need a second shot of the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 Vaccine 3 weeks after their first shot
- Your child can't get COVID-19 from any COVID-19 vaccine
- Your child may get COVID-19 vaccines and other vaccines at the same visit
