





■ Population ■ Fully vaccinated individuals ■ Partially vaccinated individuals



In the United States, the overall level of community transmission is high, with most states and territories experiencing increasing COVID-19 cases. The 7-day average of daily new cases is 89,463, which is a 43.3% increase from the previous 7-day period and a 678.6% increase from the lowest daily average in June 2021. Take actions to protect yourself and others and prevent the spread of COVID-19.

If you aren't vaccinated:

- ✅ Get vaccinated.
- 😷 Wear a mask over your nose & mouth.
- 👤 Stay at least 6 feet from others.
- 🚫 Avoid crowds & poorly ventilated spaces.
- 🧼 Wash your hands often.

Everyone in areas of substantial and high transmission should wear a mask in public indoor settings, even if vaccinated. More: <https://bit.ly/3eZ9Wak>.

- [Bristol County identified as an area of high transmission](#)

Bristol County has been identified by the CDC as an area of high transmission for COVID-19. The CDC recommends all people, no matter their vaccination status, wear masks indoors and in crowded outdoor settings in areas of substantial or high transmission. More information can be found [here](#). Other counties in Massachusetts identified as areas of high transmission include Barnstable, Nantucket, Bristol, and Dukes counties. Essex, Hampden, Middlesex, Norfolk, Plymouth and Worcester counties are identified as areas of substantial transmission and Franklin and Hampshire counties are identified as areas of moderate transmission.

- [Delta Variant](#)

The Delta variant is more contagious than previous COVID-19 strains and may cause more than twice as many infections. To maximize protection from the Delta variant and prevent possibly spreading it to others, wear a mask indoors in public – even if you’re already vaccinated and are in an area of substantial or high COVID-19 transmission.

If you’re not vaccinated against COVID-19, get vaccinated as soon as you can: www.vaccines.gov.


