

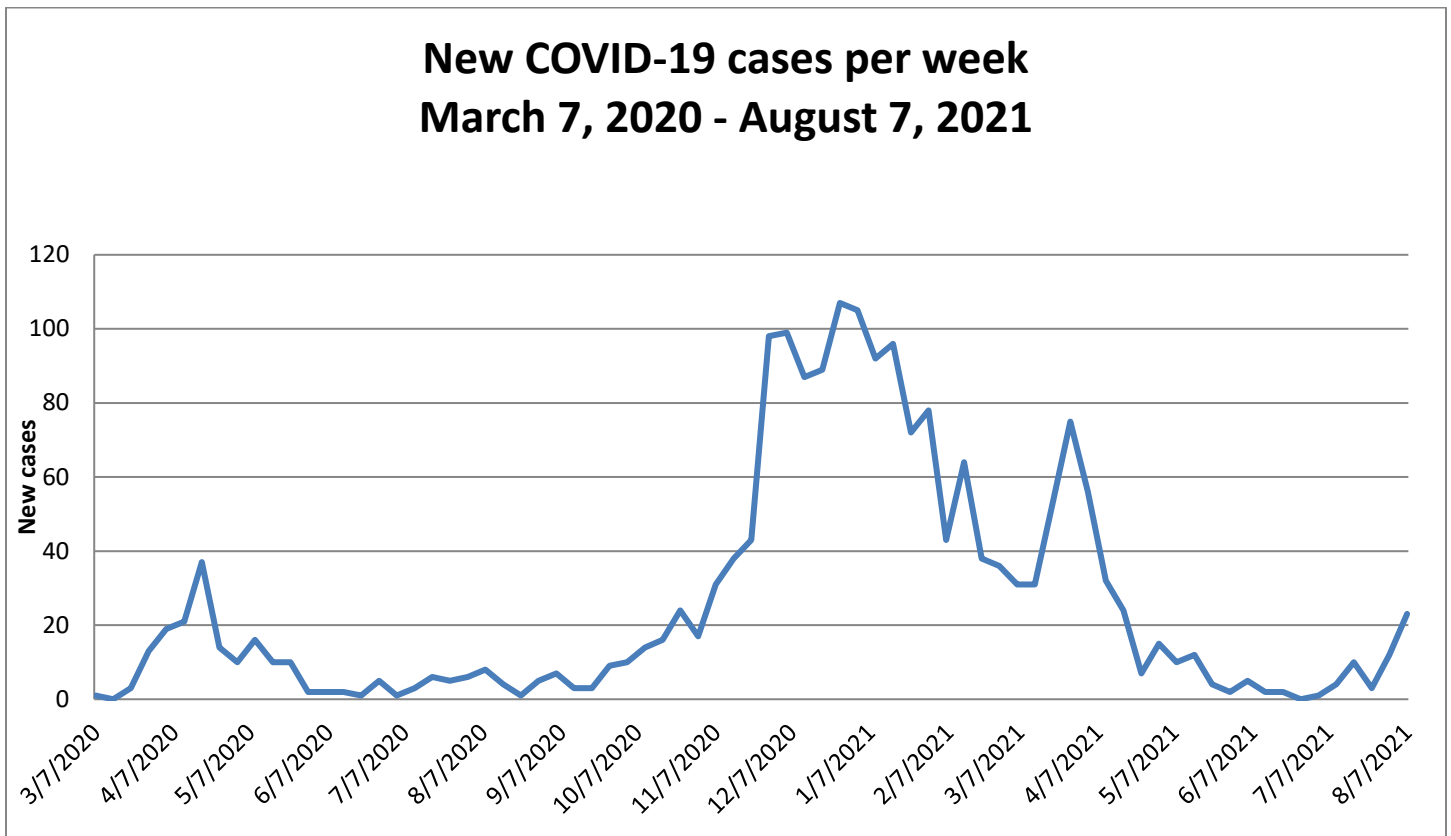

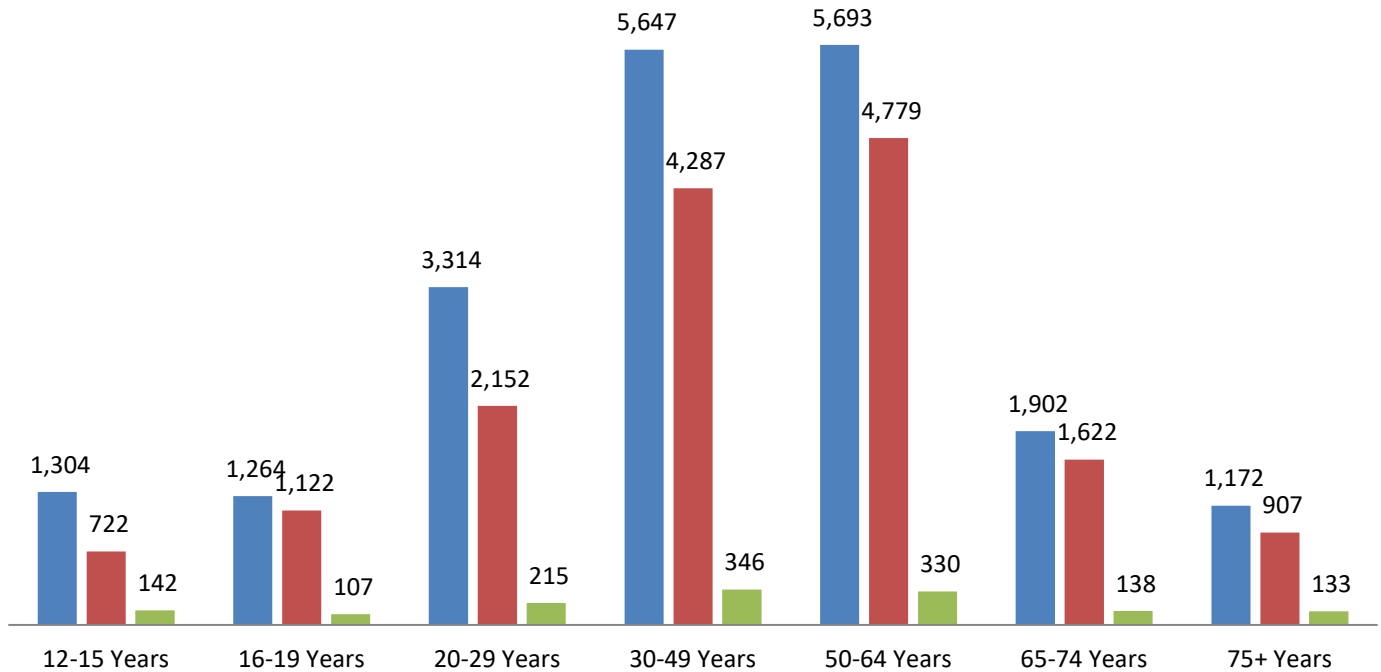

## Vaccine Distribution in Mansfield as of August 5, 2021

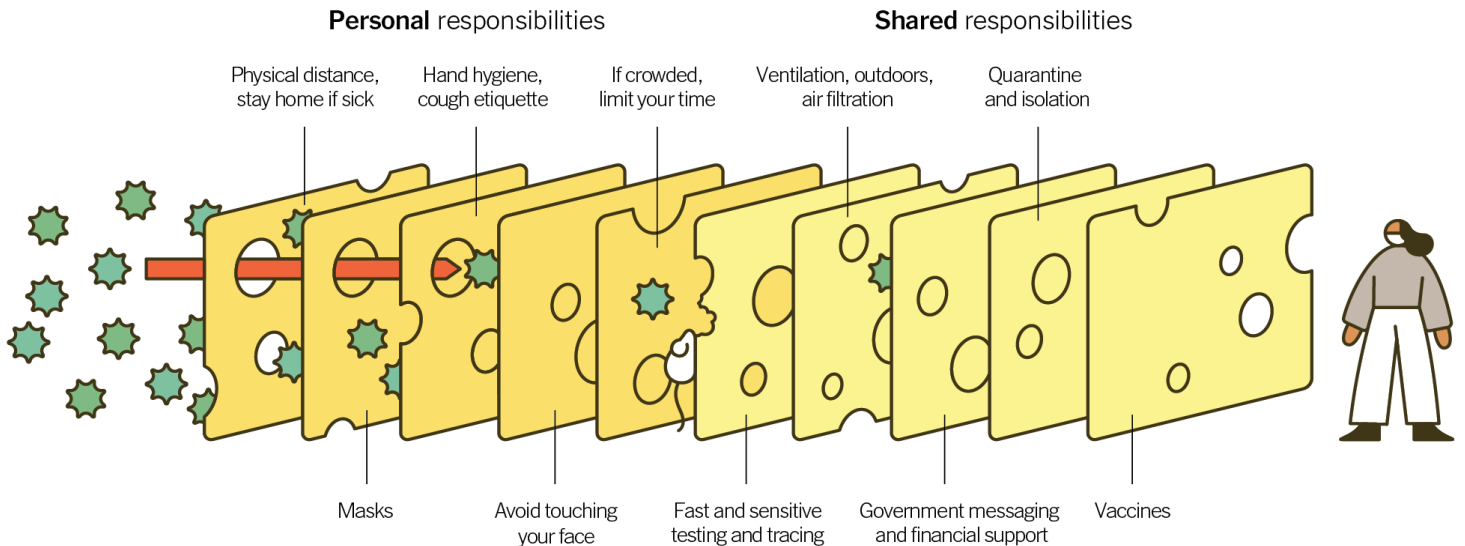
■ Population ■ Fully vaccinated individuals ■ Partially vaccinated individuals

## Multiple Layers Improve Success

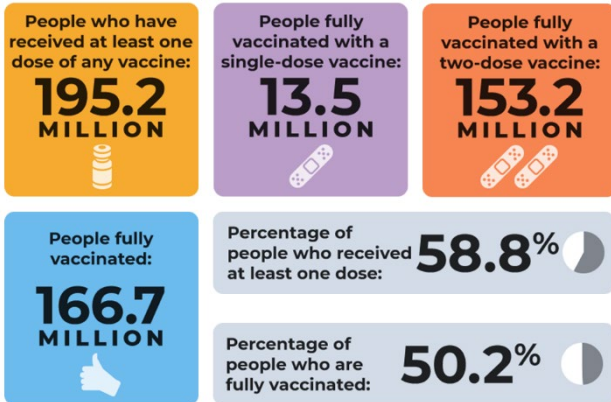

As of August 9, 2021, more than 195.2 million people, or about 58.8% of the U.S. population, have received at least one dose of a COVID-19 vaccine. Of those, 166.7 million, half of the population, are fully vaccinated.

- [Bristol County identified as an area of high transmission](#)

Bristol County has been identified by the CDC as an area of high transmission for COVID-19. The CDC recommends all people, no matter their vaccination status, wear masks indoors and in crowded outdoor settings in areas of substantial or high transmission. More information can be found [here](#). Other counties in Massachusetts identified as areas of high transmission include Barnstable, Nantucket, Bristol, and Dukes counties. Essex, Hampden, Middlesex, Norfolk, Plymouth and Worcester counties are identified as areas of substantial transmission and Franklin and Hampshire counties are identified as areas of moderate transmission.
