


COMMUNITY UPDATE COVID-19



Consider getting tested for COVID-19, regardless of your vaccination status, if you think you've been exposed or if you have symptoms. If you are fully vaccinated against COVID-19, your risk of infection is lower, but some people can still spread the Delta variant.

- [Bristol County identified as an area of high transmission](#)

Bristol County has been identified by the CDC as an area of high transmission for COVID-19. The CDC recommends all people, no matter their vaccination status, wear masks indoors and in crowded outdoor settings in areas of substantial or high transmission. More information can be found [here](#). Other counties in Massachusetts identified as areas of high transmission include

Barnstable, Nantucket, Bristol, and Dukes counties. Essex, Hampden, Middlesex, Norfolk, Plymouth and Worcester counties are identified as areas of substantial transmission and Franklin and Hampshire counties are identified as areas of moderate transmission.
